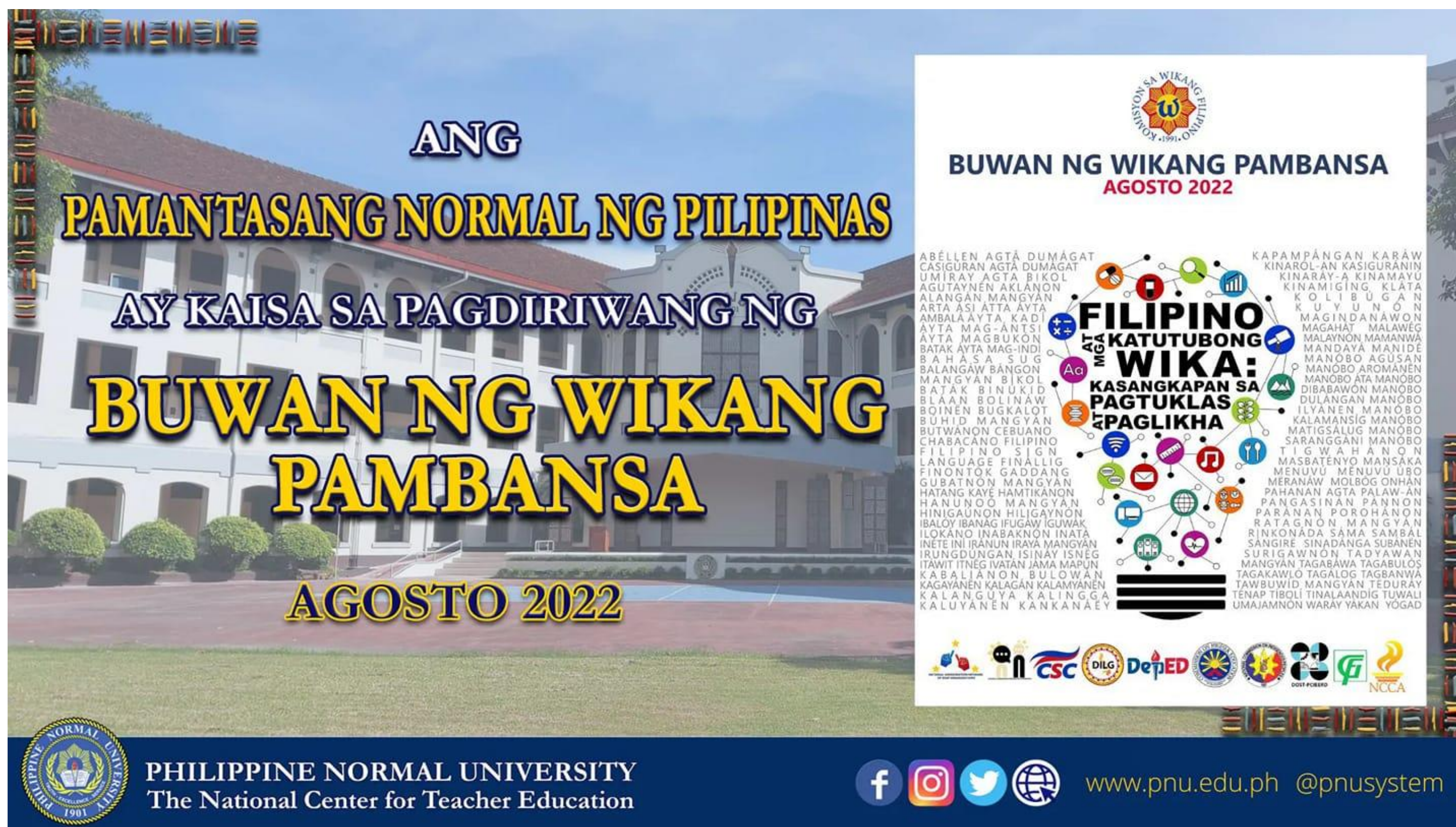

service providers may comprehensively incorporate the Philippine Professional Standards into professional development programs. This second interim report focused on how the innovations and processes LiSQuP has developed that puts the program forward as a professional development program that comprehensively incorporates the Philippine Professional Standards and captures the spirit and goals of NEAP’s transformation.

The President was joined by the LiSQuP Core Team in presenting the program’s implementation updates: Dr. Marilyn U. Balagtas, Academic Programming Committee lead, Dr. Heidi B. Macahilig, Gateway Assessment Committee lead, and Dr. Celia M. Ilanan, Training Committee lead. Dr. Balagtas led the discussion on Scholar Profiling, highlighting how the program works heavily with data to address the needs of the scholars. Dr. Macahilig and Dr. Ilanan, as leads of their respective LiSQuP committees, gave valuable updates on how Gateway Assessment and Training are currently at work in the program.

LiSQuP is supported by the Project Development Team under the Office of the Vice President for Academics (OVPA).

The event also included a campus tour courtesy of student volunteers from the Linkages and International Office (LIO) headed by Dr. Elvie Asuan.

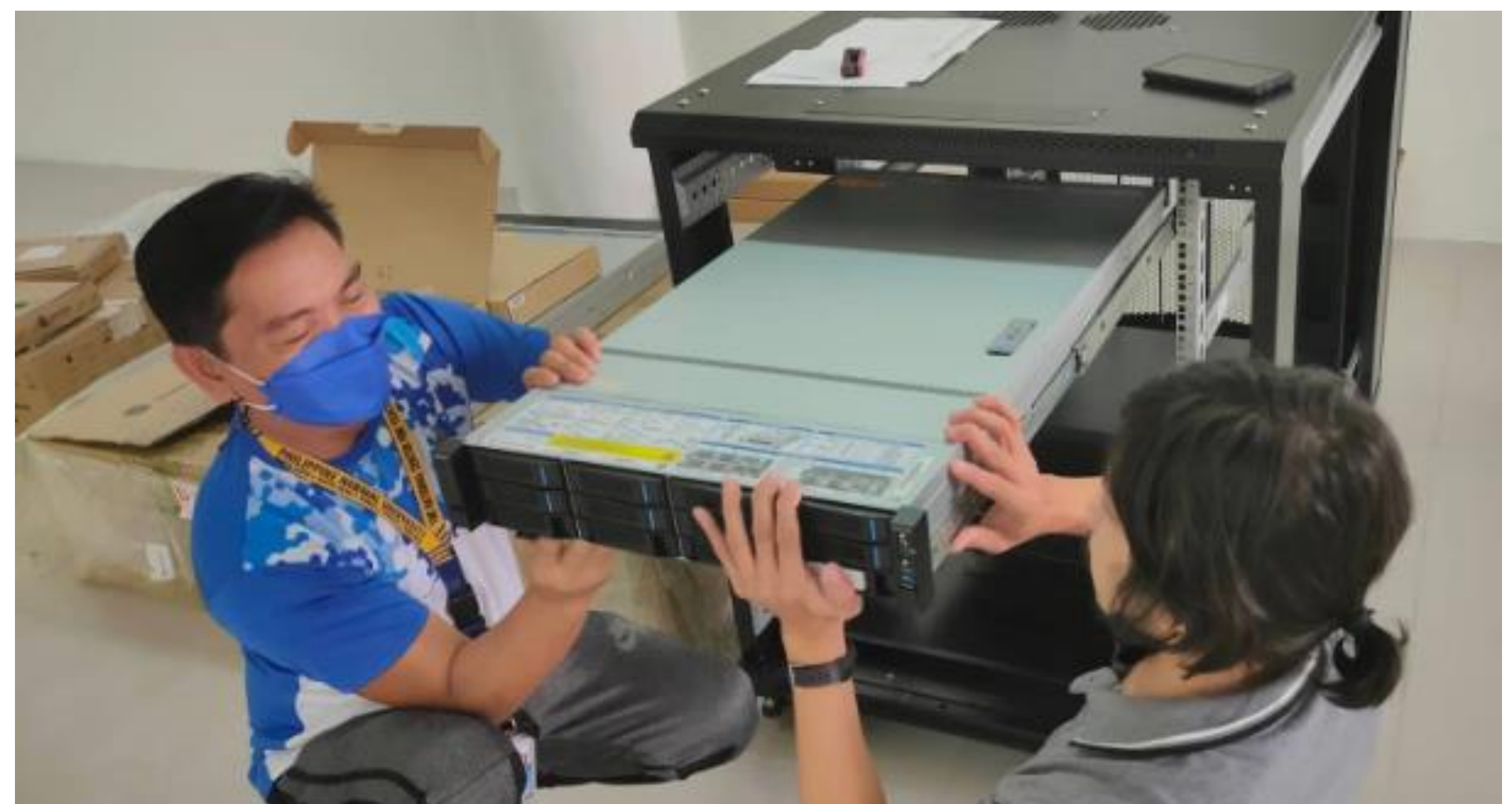

PNU System benefits from Smart Campus Project; Campus installation completed

In 2021, the Commission on Higher Education (CHED) granted the Philippine Normal University P25-million for the implementation and development of the Smart Campus Project for the PNU system. The said project, entitled “PNU 4.0: Teacher Education for the Future,” is geared towards the enhancement of the IT infrastructure and network connectivity of PNU to better facilitate a more efficient, self-reliant, and stable delivery of hybrid-flexible learning modality.

In June 2022, the Smart Campus Project Team visited the PNU campuses to deliver, install, and configure the servers and core switch which will connect them to ePNU, the in-house learning management system of the university. Previously, only PNU Manila has access to ePNU. This project enhances the PNU’s IT infrastructure; thus, it will create opportunities for the students and faculty of PNU to innovate and guarantee learning continuity amidst the flexible learning environment.



Because of this CHED grant project, the university was able to get a Hyper-Converge Infrastructure (HCI). This includes the Server Virtualization (aSV), Storage Virtualization (aSAN), Network Virtualization (aNET), and Network Function Virtualization (NFV). The HCI will provide PNU reliable and continuous access to the ePNU and fast internet access for the students and faculty. In line with this, all the campuses can utilize easily manage different applications such as PWEBSS and ePNU (LMS) plus any part of the University system.

The turnover and installation were attended by the campus EDPs and their respective Knowledge Management Officers: Prof. Jay-Ar G. Balauag (PNUNL), Engr. Dandy V. Surio (PNUSL), Prof. Randy S. Recla (PNUV) and, Prof. June R. Dumanhug (PNUM); the team was also joined by internal auditors Ms. Dolce G. Joguilon and Mr. Ryan Anthony A. Olalia.

The Smart Campus Team is composed of PNU President Dr. Bert J. Tuga and Mr. Harry Huliganga as consultants, Mr. Joemar D. Sajona as project lead, and Prof. John P. Natividad, Mr. Roxan C. Ormita, Bryan Lester Tamares, Delsie Marie E. Reyes, Regiñino S. Palma, and Ronaldo M. Vizora as project members.

PNU, RELO hold forum with collaboration program partners

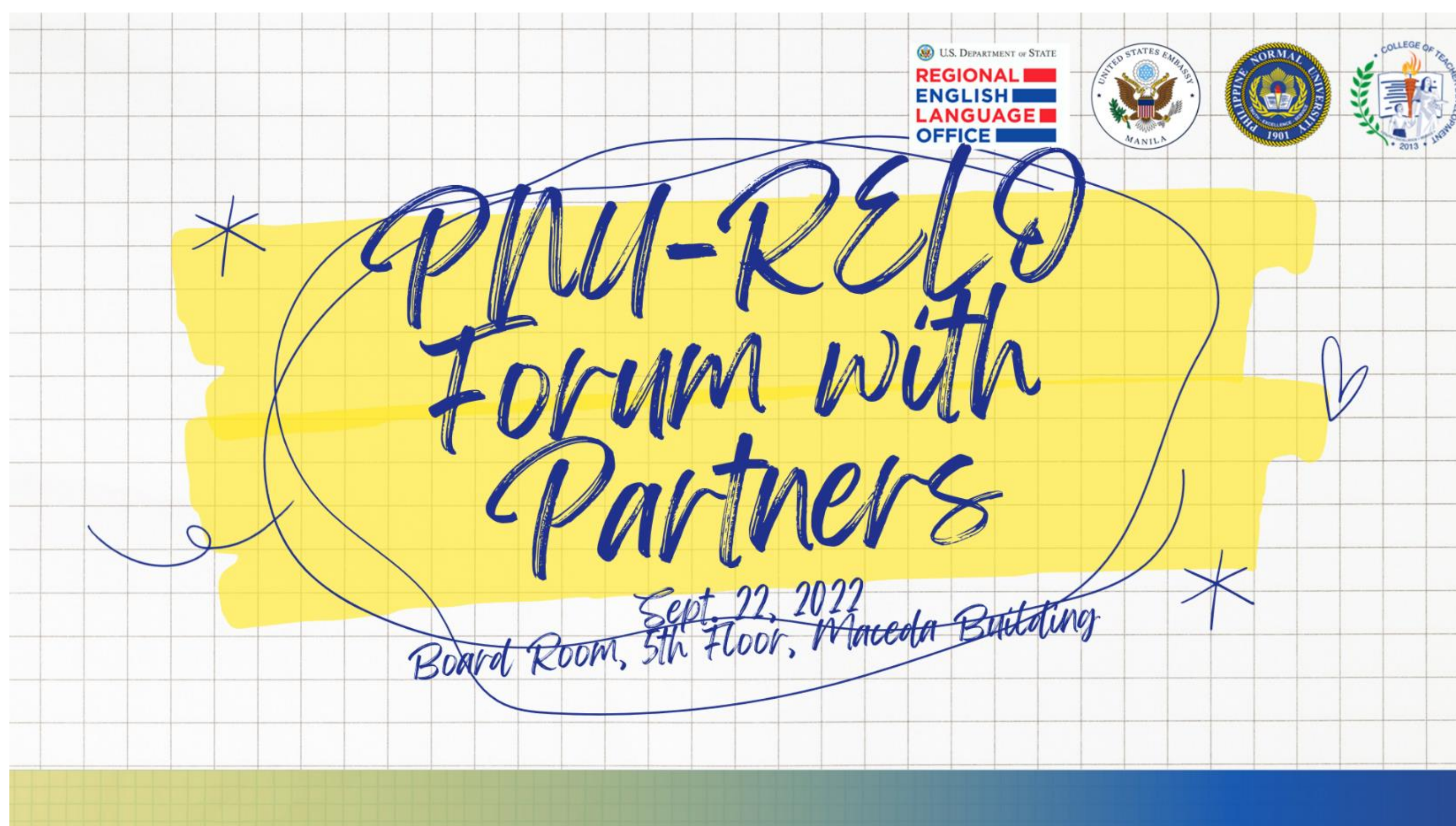

DepEd K-3 teachers from Epifanio Delos Santos Elem. School, Center of

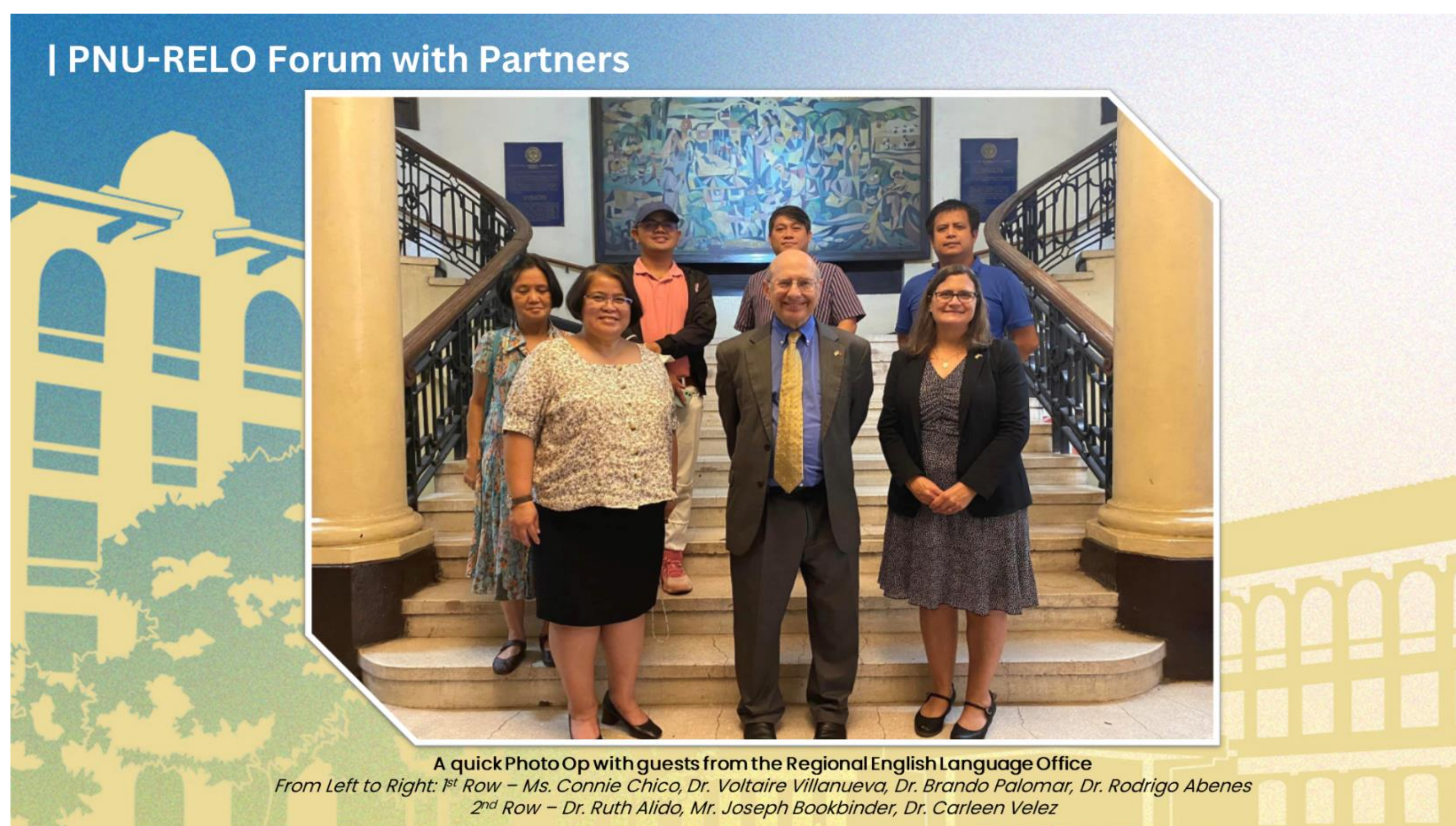

IPEHRDS commences a Skill Intervention Program (SKIP) for PE Majors

NEDA introduces ISAPLANO: PDP to Student Leaders from different Universities

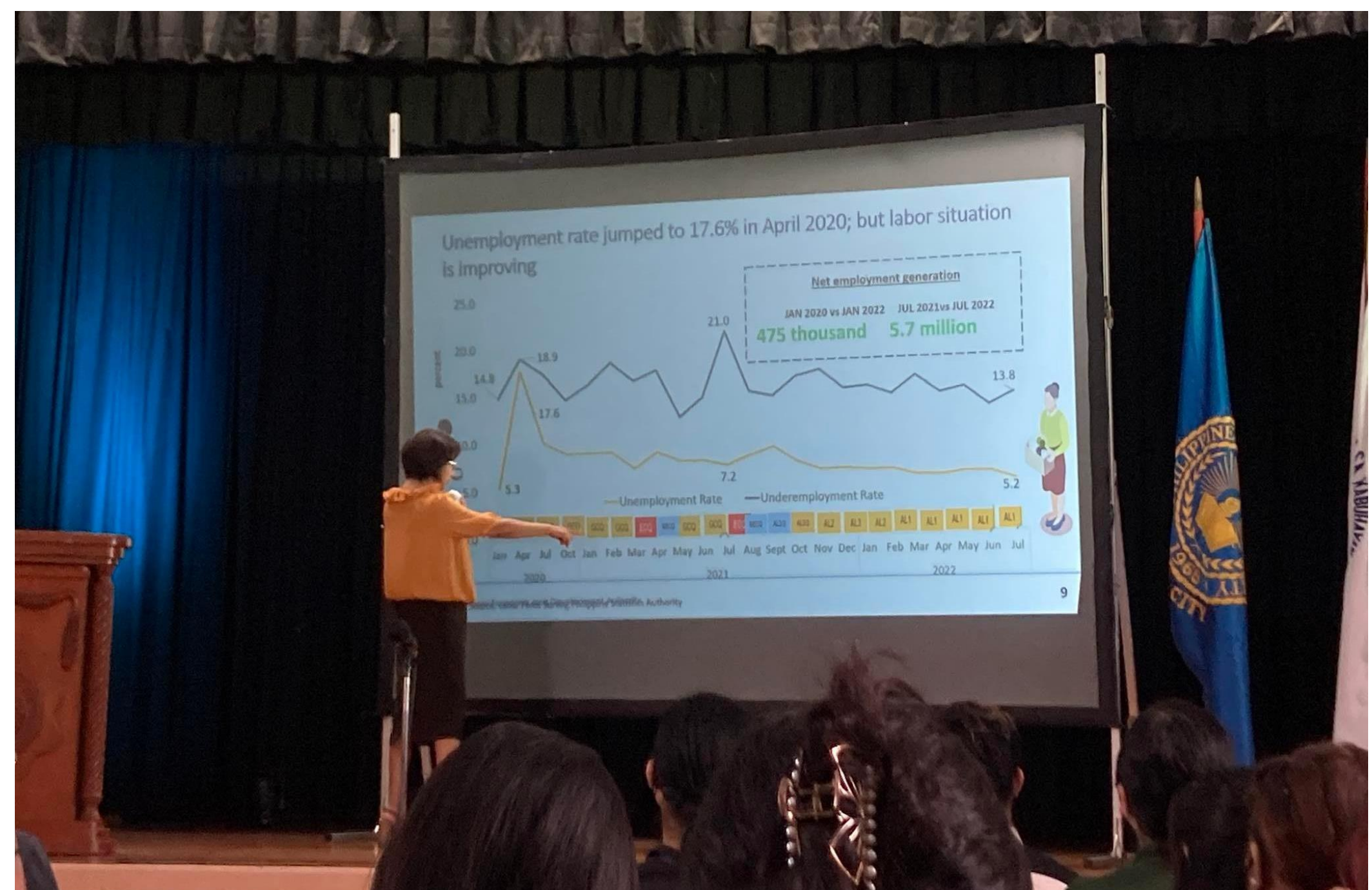

With all these demands affecting the academic, President Tuga emphasized the need “to come up with a blueprint of a future-proof PNU” that is anchored on the University's five strategic commitments—quality, inclusivity, innovation, impact, and sustainability.

Months prior to the summit, the document *PNU Academic Plans in the New Normal* that contains a culmination of the lessons from the two-year shift to Kaway-Aralan sa Bagong Kadawyan (flexible learning in the new normal) was released for consultation and progressive unit planning. The data from the limited face-to-face implementation in 2021-2022 provided additional inputs to the academic plans.

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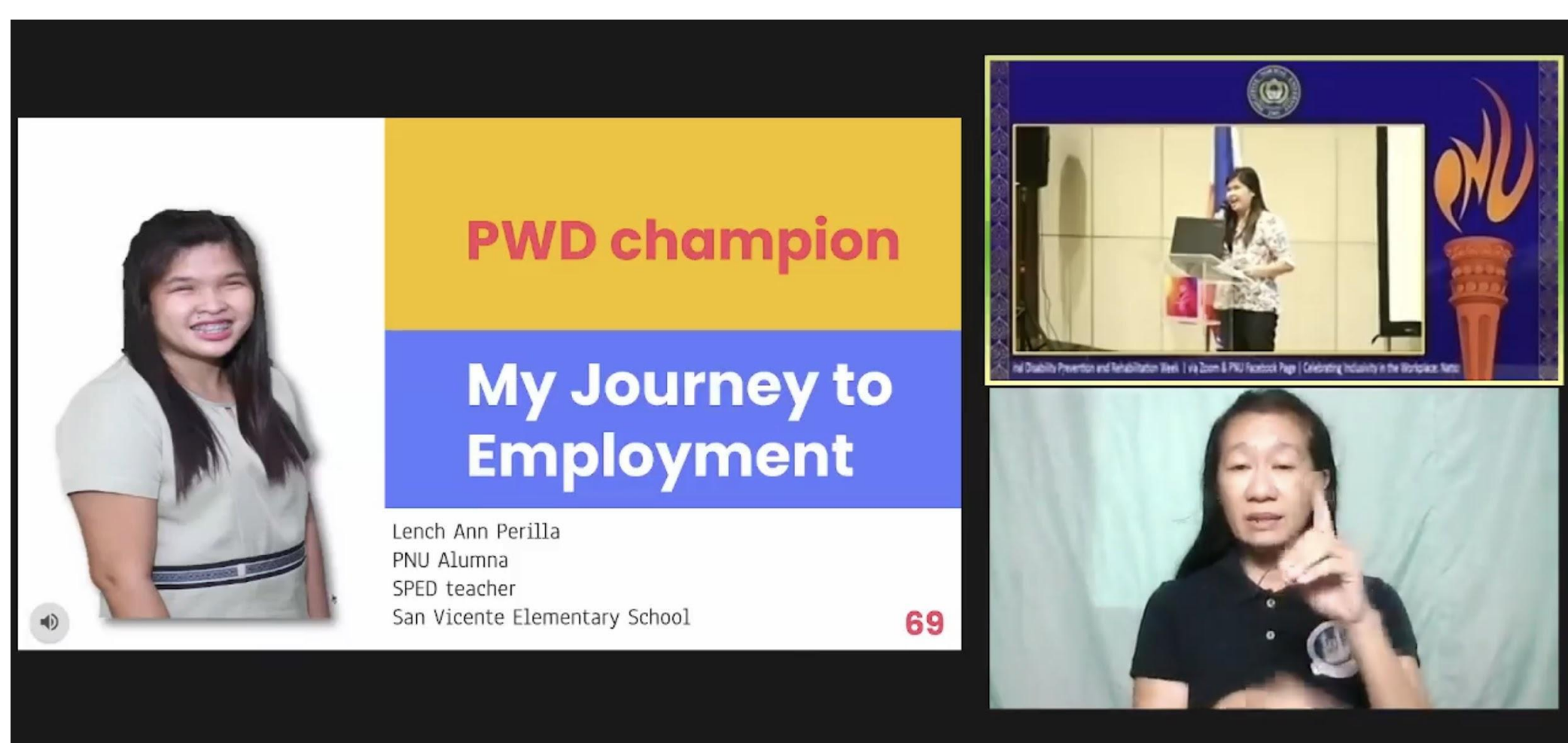

PNU Manila holds in-person commencement rites and University President's investiture

For the first time since the pandemic, the Philippine Normal University resumed its in-person graduation rites on August 17, 2022. This year's theme is "Forging Ahead: Reinventing Education in a Post-Pandemic World. The Class of 2022, together with their parents, gathered at the Philippine International Convention Center (PICC) Reception Hall to celebrate the official granting of their degrees in a solemn ceremony.

The 114th Commencement Exercises was held back-to-back with the Investiture of the 11th President of PNU, Dr. Bert J. Tuga, who assumed office on December 10, 2019, just a few months before the pandemic.

In his speech, President Tuga stated that the prevailing academic and non-academic concerns during the peak of the pandemic was a determining factor for not holding his investiture in 2020.

According to him, "There were many important and urgent concerns that we have to look into as a university—both academic and administrative matters. But after two years and seven months, we decided to hold it now because we see this as an opportunity to gather our stakeholders and partners and to share with them the new directions of the University in the years to come."

The investiture program, according to President Tuga, is a means "to signify our earnest desire to move forward towards education recovery."

"And why hold it as part of the commencement program? We want to share this moment with the most important stakeholder of the University, the students, our *raison d'être*." He added.

The investiture rites was attended by former PNU heads of institutions and members of the Board of Regents (BOR); officials and representatives from partner institutions such as the Commission on Higher Education (CHED), Department of Education (DepEd), UNESCO Asia-Pacific Centre of Education for International Understanding (APCEIU), Philippine Association of State Universities and Colleges-National Capital Region (PASUC NCR), South Manila Educational Consortium (SMEC); presidents, officials, and administrators of state and local universities and colleges (SUCs); and representatives from the private sector.

As part of his investiture address, President Tuga presented the new mission, vision, and strategic development plans (SDP) of PNU for 2022-2032.

"[The SDP] contains the new vision and mission of the University and the new strategic directions that will achieve the new mandate in the next decade. In crafting this, the University has considered the impact of the pandemic, the demands of Education 4.0, the national and global development goals, the significance of internationalization and global cooperation, and the emerging trends leading to education 5.0." he added.

114th Commencement Ceremony (Undergraduate Level)



In the morning, Dr. Aldrin A. Darilag, Commissioner of the Commission on Higher Education and Chair-Designate of the PNU Board of Regents (BOR), served as the Guest of Honor and Commencement Speaker during the commencement ceremony of the undergraduate programs. He congratulated the graduates for their hard work, dedication, and commitment in completing their academic degrees as they pursue academic excellence despite the challenges they faced during the pandemic.

Commissioner Darilag expressed his optimism that the graduates will continue to share their “talents, time, and treasure; a high degree of public service; and genuine love for the country.” He also reminded them to “manifest a marked difference for the benefit of the community with the full intention and initiative of maintaining a good name that can be modelled by the next generation.”

Addressing Batch 2022, he issued three distinct messages: (1) congratulations to the graduates and their families; (2) serve the nation; and (3) top the LEPT (Licensure Examination for Professional Teachers).

The response came from this year’s valedictorian—Ms. Hilary J. Ladesma, Bachelor in English Education, magna cum laude. In her address, she described the experiences of Batch 2022 as a book written by them. Each chapter describes their journey from being accepted to PNU to the time they finished and beyond.

She ended her speech with these important reminders, “Let’s all create the change that we are waiting for. *Ang lahat ng ating gagawin ay lagi’t laging para sa bata at para sa bayan!*”



114th Commencement Ceremony (Graduate Level)



In the afternoon, UNESCO APCEIU Director Hyun Mook Lim served as Guest of Honor and Speaker for the commencement exercises of graduate and post-baccalaureate programs. He assured the graduates that their new degrees will surely enhance and upgrade their professionalism and commitment as teachers and school leaders. He also shared APCEIU’s initiatives toward the promotion of global citizenship education (GCED), an advocacy he shares with President Tuga and PNU.

In his message, he emphasized the importance of the partnership between the Philippines and South Korea. According to him, such partnership is “crucial in the challenging times of complex crisis that requires solidarity and cooperation beyond national boundaries.” Director Lim also stressed that education has been given a special place and task in promoting justice, liberty, and peace and in promoting mutual understanding between people regardless of their nationalities.

“[...] there have always been educators who care about the purpose of education, who care about responding to the challenges of the time through education, and who care about learning to live together,” he added.

The program concluded with President Tuga reminding the graduates “to inculcate the culture of research, embed foresight and anticipatory leadership in school governance, to invest on building connections through partnerships and linkages, and to continue to learn.”

In response, Dr. Ryan V. Lansangan, recipient of the Best Dissertation Award, said that receiving their most coveted MA and PhD diplomas is not the end their journey; instead, it is a part of greater responsibilities ahead.

Dr. Lansangan emphasized that, as products of an internationally and nationally responsive teacher education university, they need to reinvent their practices that will respond even in the post-COVID world. It is therefore incumbent for the members of the academe to use this crisis-driven opportunity to reimagine how the learners, teachers, and education at large not only thrive during difficult circumstances, but also respond to a highly globalized world that is equitable for all.
