

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PNU ranks 1st in the October 2022 licensure exam for teachers

The Philippine Normal University-Manila surpassed all the higher education institutions in the country when it ranked first in the recently concluded Licensure Examination for Professional Teachers (LEPT) in the elementary level. Out of 82 takers, 78 or 95.12% passed the exam, including all first-time takers.

For the secondary level, 115 out of 138 takers passed the exam, giving PNU Manila a rating of 83.33%. For first-time takers, 91 out of 98 passed.

Mr. Alexander Robin Capito placed 7th in the elementary level with a 93.20% rating. Mr. Capito graduated from PNU Mindanao in 2019 with a degree in Bachelor in Mathematics and Science Elementary Education (BMSEE).

According to the Professional Regulation Commission (PRC), 49,783 out of 91,468 examinees (54.43%) passed the LEPT for elementary level while 71,080 out of 139,534 takers (50.94%) passed the examination for the secondary level.

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SEA-RUN is designed to provide the platform to proactively share reliable and valid research in education, science, and culture and to create a pool of research experts for the establishment of working committees or technical working groups for SEAMEO projects and programmes addressing the following: inclusive, equitable, safe, and

healthy schools; learning and skills for life, work and sustainable development; teachers, teaching and the teaching profession; digital learning and transformation; and financing of education.

The founding members are Universiti Teknologi Brunei(Brunei), Royal University of Phnom Penh (Cambodia), Gadjah Mada University (Indonesia), Souphanouvong University (Lao PDR), Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia (Malaysia), University of Information Technology (Myanmar), Chiang Rai Rajabhat University (Thailand), Duy Tan University (Vietnam), and Philippine Normal University (Philippines).



Dr. Bert J. Tuga, PNU President, attended the inaugural meeting and MOU signing, which was held at Avani Sukhumvit Hotel in Bangkok. Dr. Aldrin A. Darilag, CHED Oversight Commissioner for Teacher Education and Teacher Quality, attended the meeting and delivered the message that revolved around research development and sharing.



Bleep Test for NLec Students

The Institute of Physical Education, Health, Recreation, Dance, and Sports (IPEHRDS) led the Bleep Test for the First Year NLEC students of the Philippine Normal University-Manila on October 21, 2022 at the PNU Quadrangle. This aims to measure the students' capabilities and to test their limitations as they begin their journey as PNUans during this Academic Year 2022-2023. This activity was headed by the Director of IPEHRDS, Dr. Rosanna A. Diana. Prior to the event, the NLEC students were divided into nine clusters which were assigned with different schedules and areas to conduct the Bleep Test. The IPEHRDS faculty and staff, along with the PEMS Officers and BPHEd majors, warmly welcomed the NLEC students with the PNU Wellness Dancexercise as a warmup before dividing them into their designated clusters. During the event, Clusters 1, 4, and 7 stayed at the PNU Quadrangle; Clusters 2, 5, and 8 headed to the PNU Gymnasium; and Clusters 3, 6, and 9 were assigned to the Open Court.



After settling in their respective areas, the BPHEd marshals assisted the NLEC students in following the five processes of conducting the Bleep Test. First, they need to verify their PAR-Q registration to identify whether they have health concerns that will affect their performance during the Bleep Test. It should be noted that if a student has health concerns, his/her designated NLEC professor will give him/her a different task. Second, the students will transfer to the waiting area near the Bleep Station. Third, they will proceed to the Bleep Station wherein their capabilities and limitations will be tested through running. Fourth, after running, they are required to perform a cool-down exercise led by the assigned BPHEd majors. Fifth,they are instructed to take a picture of their form as part of their e-portfolio and evaluation.

The University Health Services Unit (UHSU) staff were also present in each area during the event to ensure the health and safety of the students. The event ended at exactly 3:00 in the afternoon, leaving the university with uplifting vibes from the NLEC students.

NEAP QAD conducts first validation of LiSQuP implementation

Present in the meeting were representatives from the Graduate School of EduHK composed of Prof. LO Sing Kai, Associate Vice President for Assessment and Graduate Studies and Dean of Graduate School; Ms. CHUNG Yin Tung Crystal, Chief of Staff; and Ms. WANG Faye, Global Collaborator Manager. From PNU, the following officials were present: Dr. Lordinio A. Vergara, Vice President for University Relations and Advancement (VPURA); Dr. Ruth A. Alido, Dean of the College of Teacher Development (CTD); Dr. Brando C. Palomar, Associate Dean of the Faculty of Science, Technology, and Mathematics (FSTeM); Dr. Rodrigo D. Abenes, Associate Dean of the Graduate Teacher Education Faculty (GTEF); Mr. Bryan C. Dayuta, OIC-Director of the Linkages and International Office (LIO); and Dr. Allen A. Espinosa, Faculty Researcher at the Educational Policy Research and Development (EPRDC).



The meeting served as an avenue for the two universities to discuss the different challenges brought by the pandemic as well as the different initiatives undertaken by PNU and EduHK to curb the impact of COVID-19 on teaching and learning. During the meeting, Dr. Alido emphasized the innovative strategies employed by PNU to

address the disruptions in teaching and learning experienced by PNU through its Kaway-Aralan sa Bagong Kadawyan.

Following the discussion of Dr. Alido, Dir. Dayuta laid out the structure of LIO and presented the different internationalization targets of PNU including PNU's participation in three international ranking and rating metrics such as the Times Higher Education (THE) Impact Ranking, World's Universities with Real Impact (WURI), and Quacquarelli Symonds (QS) Stars Rating. He also discussed the different local and international partnerships of PNU with other universities and organizations.

Similarly, Dr. Abenes provided an overview of the curricular offerings of the College of Graduate Studies and Teacher Education Research (CGSTER) while Dr. Espinosa presented VPRPQA's overall management and operation of the university's programs relevant to research, planning, and quality assurance.

Prof. LO presented EduHK's initiatives and collaborations with international partners and universities. He shared their previous and current programs and discussed which of these has entry points for possible collaboration with PNU. He also offered several proposals such as faculty scholarships, joint seminars and workshops, and a joint academic center between EduHK, PNU, and another Normal school in Hong Kong that will target in-service teacher training in the Asian region.


The meeting between the two institutions was facilitated by the LIO.

PNU and APCEIU collaborate anew for an online training course on GCED Pedagogy and Practice for ASEAN Educators

With the success of the first run of the Global Citizenship Education (GCED) Pedagogy and Practice Online Training Course in 2021 that was jointly developed and delivered by the Philippine Normal University and the Asia-Pacific Centre of Education for International Understanding (APCEIU) under the auspices of UNESCO, the same course was once again offered in 2022. While the previous implementation focused on Filipino teachers, this year's offering was expanded to educators in the ASEAN region. The 36 completers of the course were from Indonesia, Vietnam, Thailand, and the Philippines.

The five-week online training course was conducted from September 5 to October 8, 2022 via the GCED Online Campus, the online learning platform of APCEIU. It provided guidance to teacher-participants on GCED integration in the various subject areas. The teacherparticipant completers accomplished all requirements of the four modules: The Teaching of GCED: Underlying Principles and Concepts (Module 1); GCED Pedagogy: Tools and Strategies (Module 2); Integrating and Contextualizing GCED in the different Learning/Content Areas (Module 3); and Pedagogy Exemplars: GCED in Practice (Module 4). The modules were taught by Dr. Bert J. Tuga, Dr. Rowena R. Hibanda, Dr. Rita B. Ruscoe, and Dr. Zyralie L. Bedural and Dr. Ma. Lorella C. Arabit-Zapatos, respectively. Lesson exemplars with GCED integration were developed as their final output for this online training course.

PNU faculty members join ESTA Academic Staff Tour (AST) in Ludwigsburg, Germany

As part of the Educating Science Teachers for All (ESTA) Project, three PNU delegates, namely Dr. Ruth A. Alido (Languages), Dr. Arlyne C. Marasigan (Chemistry and Comparative Education), and Prof. Alfons Jayson O. Pelgone (Physics Education) participated in the Academic Staff Tour (AST) on October 17-18, 2022 held at Ludwigsburg University of Education in Germany. The PNU team reported on the projects conducted, which included the development of a framework for inclusive science education incorporating culture and language diversity and the national training of university educators in the Philippines. Other delegates to the AST were participating universities from Limerick, Georgia, Germany, and De La Salle University (DLSU), Manila.

The AST activities included lectures of Prof. Sylvija Markic, ESTA project coordinator, on the current status of the project; Prof. Corina Monch on pedagogical scientific language knowledge; Lilith Rüschenpöhler on chemistry capital and cultural differences in chemistry; and the Germany ESTA Team on working on portfolios. Laboratory and classroom observations of junior high school students in Ludwigsburg led by Sarah Kieferle were likewise included in the visit along with discussions on future ESTA collaborations.

The PNU-ESTA team is headed by Dr. Marie Paz E. Morales, Director of the Publications Office. She will lead the PNU team in the Academic Staff Tour to be held in Georgia in January 2023.





PNU, CHED host International Conference on Quality Education in the New Normal

The Philippine Normal University (PNU) and the Commission on Higher Education (CHED) co-organized the International Conference on Quality Education in the New Normal on November 17-18, 2022 at the Rizal Park Hotel, Manila. Anchored on the theme "Sustaining Education Gains Beyond the Pandemic," the international conference focused on the urgent concerns of the education sector in the post-pandemic scenario; review education gains during the pandemic and agree on ways of sustaining these gains; discuss the importance of teacher quality as priority education reform direction in the new normal; suggest critical pedagogies and

On Day 1, Dr. Bert J. Tuga, PNU President, said in his welcome message, "Today, more than ever, the daunting task of reimagining how teacher education and teacher quality can shape the future of humanity and the planet will drive our redirections in the constantly evolving education landscape."

"As Teacher Education Institutions, we must situate ourselves in these unprecedented circumstances and take action, driven by our collective commitments and propelled by our shared vision of the future. [...] Our initiatives must involve careful, collaborative planning and extensive expert engagement through active conversations and meaningful discussions," he added.

Dr. Aldrin A. Darilag, CHED Commissioner and Oversight Commissioner for Teacher Education and Teacher Quality, commended PNU for hosting the conference and highlighted the theme of the conference as a testimony to the continued commitment to quality education. According to Commissioner Darilag, "the pandemic brought out the best in us to continue with the goal to set the standards for inclusivity and excellence in education." He also reminded the participants that collective efforts must be translated into responsive and globally competitive outcomes and HEIs should mold future actors of the nation which will bring progress and change

The opening program was followed by the keynote address on "Reimagining Education and Teacher Education in the New Normal: Sustaining Gains and Teacher Quality in the New Normal" delivered by Dr. Low Ee Ling, Dean of Academic and Faculty Affairs, National Institute of Education, Nanyang Technological University, Singapore.

In her keynote message, Dr. Low discussed education resilience, values-anchored education, evidence-based education, and lifelong education as anchors in sustaining education gains achieved during the pandemic.

Dr. Low also described the future of education to focus on the 3Cs in the Post-C World: Continual learning, learning for life, and learning through education; Connections and collaboration for value creation; and Confidence in building ourselves and our contributions.

The keynote address was followed by the responses to the question "How may the Philippine teacher education identify and sustain gains to support national education growth?" from Dr. Ester B. Ogena, Former PNU President and Lead Domain Expert in Education, CHED-AIM Global Academic Program, and Dr. Joyce B. Molino-Magtolis, Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences, Leyte Normal University and who represents President Evelyn B. Aguirre

The ensuing presentations and discussions focused on specific themes, as follows:

Futuring in Education

Prof. Michael Wilson, Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Research) of the University of New England in Australia, delivered the plenary talk with emphasis on the future of education. He shared that the future model of universities will focus on student outcomes tailored to each individual student and described the future of education to be low-cost, outcomes-based, time-independent, digital, and individualized.

Future-Ready Education

Dr. Libing Wang, Chief of Section for Educational Innovations and Skills of UNESCO Bangkok, delivered the plenary talk. Joining him as discussants were Fr. Johnny C. Go SJ, Founding Dean of the Gokongwei Brothers School of Education and Learning Design, Ateneo de Manila University; and Dr. Lizan Perante-Calina, Dean of the Graduate School of Public and Development Management, Development Academy of the Philippines.

Teacher Education for Sustainability and Lifelong Learning

Day 1 capped off with a panel discussion on Teacher Education for Sustainability and Lifelong Learning. Present were CHED Commissioner Aldrin A. Darilag; Dr. Gloria Jumamil-Mercado, Undersecretary for Human Resource and Organizational Development, Department of Education; Mr. Benjo Basas Chairperson, Teachers' Dignity Coalition; Ms. Susan M. Carandang, OIC-Chief Economic Development Specialist, Education and Skills Development Division, Social Development Staff, National Economic and Development Authority (NEDA); and Ms. Diane Fajardo-Valencia Deputy Executive Director, Philippine Business for Education (PBEd).

The international conference continued on Day 2 with several relevant topics.

Teacher Quality and Education Gains

Dr. John Pegg, Director of the SiMERR National Research Center of the University of New England in Australia, delivered a plenary talk titled "Making Operations Clear, Straightforward, and Efficient: A 'Systems Thinking' Approach." He tackled the urgent concerns of the Philippine education sector in the post-pandemic scenario and the importance of teacher quality as a priority in education reform in the new normal. He highlighted the significance of the quality of the work organization in which teachers found themselves in; the quality of teacher selection and education; the quality of teacher careers; and the quality of teacher evaluation.

VP and DepEd Secretary Duterte on modern, nimble, and equitable education

Hon. Sara Z. Duterte, Vice President of the Philippines and Department of Education Secretary, delivered her keynote address. She thanked PNU and its Research Center for Teacher Quality (RCTQ) for their technical support and assistance in crafting landmark projects and programs of DepEd such as the Senior High School Program and the Republic Act No. 11713 or the Excellence in Teacher Education Act.

The Vice President and DepEd Secretary shared that when she accepted being the DepEd Secretary, she recognized the "enormity of the responsibility of being the Secretary," particularly in solving the problems confronting Philippine education during and after the pandemic. She also highlighted the vital role of access, equity, quality, and resilience in addressing learning losses and sustaining education gains during the pandemic.

She added that school leaders must be efficient and nimble in their school governance and management

process and to adopt a whole of society approach to deliver education programs, address the diverse learner needs, and improve learning conditions. Moreover, she reiterated the importance of reading and mathematics, "Itigil muna natin ang ibang programa at [tutukan] muna ang pagbabasa at math." She encouraged the conference participants to unite and collaborate to ensure the future workforce are equipped and productive.

VP Sara's keynote was followed by responses from Congressman Marquez "Mark" O. Go, Chair of the House Committee on Higher and Technical Education (CHTE), who was represented by Ms. Charis Go, the Committee's Supervising Political Affairs Officer; Dr. Shirley C. Agrupis, President of Mariano Marcos State University; and Dr. Milabel E. Ho, Executive Director of the Accrediting Agency of Chartered Colleges and Universities in the Philippines (AACCUP), Inc.

High-Performing School Systems and Teacher Education Governance

In the afternoon, a panel discussion on High-Performing School Systems and Teacher Education Governance was presented by expert panelist Prof. David Aldridge, Head of Secondary and Further Education of Edge Hill University in the United Kingdom.

The discussants were Dr. John Addy S. Garcia, Dean of Br. Andrew Gonzales FSC College of Education at the De La Salle University; and Prof. Flora Arellano, Executive Board Member of E-Net Philippines.

CHED Chair De Vera on evidence-based, high impact education research

Concluding the 2-day event was the conference message delivered by Dr. J. Prospero E. De Vera III, CHED Chairperson. He urged the participants to prioritize evidence-based, high-impact research to address the gaps in teacher education pertaining to teacher readiness and performance in the LET and in the workplace.

"Ang ginagawa ng CHED ngayon, we are trying to get good universities to produce research that could provide the data [...] Gusto naming malaman—what should be studied? What's the difference between the good performing and not so good performing schools? [Is it in] governance, the learning environment, in the intervention?"

According to Chairperson De Vera, the idea is that the data will enable CHED to assess and evaluate the performance of TEIs and provide them with the relevant and appropriate intervention mechanism to support them

Officials and faculty members from different state universities and colleges (SUC), local universities and colleges (LUC), and representatives from the Department of Education (DepEd), CHED, private schools, and other education organizations attended the conference.

The proceedings of the conference are expected to pave the way for crafting the Teacher Education Recovery and Continuity Roadmap to stimulate innovation and introduce possible routes for education reforms, upgrade and improve learning pedagogies, school governance mechanisms, and gain a deeper understanding of education quality in the new normal, while continuously addressing national and global development goals.

The conference shall conclude in January 2023 with a keynote from Dr. Linda Darling-Hammond, Charles E. Ducommun Professor of Education Emeritus at the Stanford Graduate School of Education. It will also involve a student congress to be facilitated by the Philippine Association of Graduate Students in Teacher Education (PAGSTE).



PNU participates in the IEAE 2022 international conference in Mexico

Dr. Marilyn U. Balagtas, Dean of the College of Graduate Studies and Teacher Education Research (CGSTER), represented the Philippine Normal University in the 47th International Conference organized by the International Association of Educational Assessment (IAEA) held in Anahuac University in Mexico City on October 2-7, 2022. The conference theme is "Contributions of Assessment to Quality Education: Sustainable Development Goal 4."


Dr. Balagtas' participation showed PNU's responsiveness to the need for quality and appropriate assessment in the new normal where she presented two research studies about assessment conducted before and during the COVID-19 pandemic. She is one of three participants from the Philippines who actively participated in this conference.



Dr. Balagtas' presented a research titled "Assessing Teacher Quality through e-Portfolios: Basis of Assessment in the New Normal," which covered data from her institutionally-funded research before the global pandemic on the use of electronic portfolios (or e-portfolios) in assessing the attainment of the standards for beginning teachers (Career Stage 1) defined by the Philippine Professional Standards for Teachers (PPST). Together with Dr. Marilou M. Ubiña and Ms. Marjorie P. Naquita, Dr. Balagtas also analyzed some e-portfolios of graduate students who are taking Master of Arts in Educational Assessment and Evaluation during the COVID-19 pandemic to gauge their attainment of the PPST-based

standards for highly proficient teachers (Career Stage 3). Using a researcher-developed checklist and rubric validated by experts, e-portfolio assessment was proven to be an effective assessment approach in collecting evidence and in verifying the attainment of the professional standards for teachers across two career stages (Teacher Career Stages 1 and 3) before and even during the pandemic. Hence, Balagtas et al. (2022) recommended that teachers across career stages be assessed using their professional e-portfolios as an appropriate way of teacher assessment particularly in the new normal where the use of technology is inevitable.

Dr. Balagtas also presented a research project with Ms. Marjorie P. Naquita, her thesis advisee, titled "Use of Interdisciplinary Approach in Performance-based Assessment in the New Normal." This study assessed the management of existing policies, guidelines, and procedures in the implementation of the interdisciplinary approach in performancebased assessment (IAPA) before and during the pandemic as a basis for proposing improvements in IAEA implementation in the new normal. This study, conducted through surveys and interviews, involved senior high school science teachers and school leaders from private and public schools in Metro Manila. The results revealed that the management of IAPA is effective and that it benefits students and teachers in many ways. However, it also has weaknesses, which are associated with the role of school leaders in the implementation of the policies, guidelines, and/or procedures, especially during the new education setting. The study provides for improving implementation in the new normal covering both the face-to-face and online learning modalities.





Tuga participated in the ADB-THF Professional Development Program organized by the Asian Development Bank and The HEAD Foundation on November 7-11, 2022 in Singapore. Attended by education leaders and policy makers from Bangladesh, Indonesia, the Philippines, Sri Lanka, and Vietnam, the training program revolved around the theme, "systemic, sustainable, and strategic education reform and implementation."

The program focused on the key drivers and challenges of education reform and implementation, and identified existing and potential stakeholders needed in the



systematic implementation of reforms. Similarly, the program introduced the participants to digital education frameworks, digital solutions in learning contents, teacher development, and learning assessment. It also highlighted the necessity of adopting digital learning solutions, innovations in pre-service and in-service professional development, and the role of education research in informing policy design and implementation.



As part of the training, the participants also visited the Singapore National Library Board and model schools such as Crescent School Temasek Polytechnic experience and learn about education 4.0 and school-industry partnership.

The program concluded with a facilitated discussion where the country groups shared their ideal future scenarios and actionable suggestions that are aligned with sustainable, systemic. strategic education reform and

implementation in their respective countries.





PNU professors attend various international meetings and workshops

As part of the Philippine Normal University's commitment to provide lifelong learning and continuing professional development for its faculty and promote internationalization through faculty mobility, four faculty members attended different engagements abroad where they shared their academic and research expertise with foreign participants.



The Philippine Normal University is among the 12 Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) that represented in the first cohort for the Post-Graduate Certificate for Academic Practice (PGCAP) through the Transformative Academic Practice for Higher Education in the Philippines (TAPHEP) Project spearheaded by the University of the Philippines Los Baños (UPLB) and funded by the Commission on Higher Education (CHED). The TAPHEP Project aims to provide training and certification to teaching professionals in Philippine HEIs by the University of Liverpool (UoL) and the AdvancedHE of the United Kingdom (UK). After completing the eight-month certification program that is composed of four modules, the trained faculty members are expected to design and implement echo seminars throughout the country in collaboration with their course facilitators in UoL to at least 50 participants from their partner HEIs. The conferment of the postgraduate certificate in academic practice to the first cohort of participants in the TAPHEP Program will be done in 2023.

The TAPHEP participants visited UoL on November 5-13, 2022 to attend on-site meetings and training regarding professional standards and certification as well as to progress the objectives of the TAPHEP Project. The participants also discussed their experiences with the PGCAP and reflected on a selection of academic development programs offered by UoL. The participants were able to attend classes and observe the best academic practices of UoL, as well as communicate with some students and faculty members.

The participants also had brainstorming sessions on the content of the nationwide echo seminar for Philippine HEIs that will commence in the second quarter of 2023. The proposed topics and the implementation of the seminars were presented to the faculty members of UoL who handle the PGCAP modules. The future direction is for each participant to identify partner HEIs that will participant in the echo seminars on transformative academic practices in tertiary education, which include talks and activities about Reflective Teaching, Inclusive Higher Education, Global Trends in Higher Education, Career Development Planning for Teachers at the Tertiary Level, and many more.

This project is part of Germany's effort to promote equity and access to quality education among Christians living on the eastern part of the predominantly Muslim country. Jointly led by the Osnabrueck University of Applied Sciences and the Universitas Kristen Duta Wacana (UKDW), the program involves four Christian universities, namely, Universitas

Halmahera in Maluku, Universitas Kristen Wira Wacana in Sumba, Universitas Ottow Geisler in Papua, and UKDW in Jogjakarta. Each university is represented by the rector and three to five other members of the top management team. The training team consists of DIES alumni and experts from Germany (2), Indonesia (5), Malaysia (1), and the Philippines (1) and is supported by three German staff.

Due to pandemic restrictions, the conferences, workshops, focus group discussions, and enrichment days from 2020 to 2021 were held online. However, early this year, the Indonesian and Malaysian members of the training team conducted in-person workshops in Sumba, Maluku, and Papua. Finally, the first inperson conference for all trainers and participants was held in Yogyakarta, Indonesia on November 21-25, 2022 where the participants presented their Project Action Plan reports and engaged in team building activities and workshops. Along with the trainers, the participants benchmarked with three universities in Yogyakarta, namely, Universitas Sanata Dharma, Universitas Islam Indonesia, and UKDW. The next and final in-person conference is set for October 2023 at Silliman University in Dumaguete City.

The Asia Pacific Quality Network (APQN) Annual Academic Conference and Annual General Assembly was held on November 23-29, 2022 at the Lifelong Learning Institute in Singapore. Its main theme is "Quality Assurance for Higher Education under the Covid-19 Pandemic and Beyond in Asia-Pacific Region."

Dr. Glenda O. De Lara, a PNU faculty member of the College of Graduate Studies and Teacher Education Research (CGSTER), was invited as a speaker. She was joined by Dr. Milabel E. Ho, Executive Director of the Accrediting Agency of Chartered Colleges and Universities in the Philippines (AACCUP), Inc. and other members of their Board of Trustees (BOT).

Mr. Michael Francis Garma, a student under the PhD in Education Leadership and Management (EDLM) program mentored by Dr. De Lara, attended as a participant and presenter. Their research titled "Experiences in On-Line Accreditation Systems: Inputs to Enhancement Plan" was among those selected for presentation during the conference. They had the opportunity to benchmark the best practices on quality assurance of other international academic institutions.

Dr. Celina P. Sarmiento, a PNU faculty member of the College of Flexible Learning and ePNU (CFlex), presented a research paper at The Asian Conference on Education (ACE) 2022 held on November 28-December 2, 2022 onsite at the Toshi Center Hotel in Tokyo, Japan, which was also live-streamed online.

Dr. Sarmiento's presentation is titled "Using Action Research to Enhance Formative Assessment in Statistics," which is a self-initiated research project that she co-authored with Dr. Maricar S. Prudente of the De La Salle University (DLSU). Her presentation describes a process of enhancing formative assessment in an online higher education Statistics class through action research and could serve as an insight for delivering assessment effectively in a flexible learning environment.



Now in its 14th year, ACE was founded by the research organization International Academic Forum (IAFOR) to bring together scholars and educators from around the globe and provide a venue to discuss ideas critical to the development of education in Asia and beyond. Moreover, the annual conference provides an opportunity for developing linkages and facilitating partnerships across disciplinary borders. IAFOR, hosted in Osaka University's School of International Policy, has numerous

university partners worldwide and has several annual conferences on education that explores common themes in different ways to develop a shared research agenda that develops interdisciplinary discussion, heightens intercultural awareness, and promotes international exchange.

The delegation was headed by Dr. Serafin A. Arviola, Jr., Director of GCC Philippines, and Mr. Carl O. Dellomos, Deputy Director. Joining them were the Project Directors: Dr. Rowena R. Hibanada, Dr. Zyralie Lotivio-Bedural, and Ms. Iona Ofelia B. Zanoria.

Referring to the passage of the R.A. 11713, "What we have is now a bill, a law that we're truly proud of—I am immensely proud that we surpassed all the hurdles and challenges [and] collectively put our hearts and minds [on the] concept and plans that have become the foundation of RA 11713," said Nograles.

"[R.A. 11713] will make teacher quality in the Philippines at par and even surpass international standards" and "this will be manifested in the kind of Filipino learners we will produce and the quality of life of the next Filipinos to come," he added.

Sen. Villanueva reflected on the role of education in solving societal problems. "If education [has] equal solutions. Ibig sabihin po ang formula ay educators at teachers. Hindi po masasagot ang problema sa ng ating lipunan kung wala po ang mga guro at educators. Kaya ang parangal na ito ay inaalay ko sa lahat ng guro ng ating bayan."





Former Mayor Moreno expressed his respect and appreciation for public schools and public-school teachers. According to him, his experience in the public school system became the "tools [at] mga bagay na ginamit ko noong ako ay nabigyan ng pagkakataon na pamunuan ang ating minamahal na kapitolyo ng ating bansa."

Sen. Gatchalian echoed the sentiment expressed by Dr. Tuga regarding the Gawad Sulo as a call to action. According to the senator, "Marami pa ho tayong trabaho na dapat gawin. Hindi po natatapos dito sa parangal ang ating trabaho, dito po naguumpisa ang mahaba nating tatahakin para po maiangat ang antas ng edukasyon sa atin. Ako po ay naniniwala wala na pong ibang mabisang solusyon kundi para maiangat sa kahirapan ang ating mga kababayan."





Aside from the Gawad Sulo awardees, a salute to excellence was also given to PNU alumni who have received recognitions from their own areas of
